The Camera of Disaster Studio for Propositional Cinema

The current exhibition *The Camera of Disaster* by the Studio for Propositional Cinema focuses on photography as a medium that is threatened with extinction. In the midst of our political, cultural and ecological crises in the world, the exhibition takes a look at the drama of photography: it threatens to be destroyed by censorship, the power of data clouds or ecological catastrophes. The Camera of Disaster is the invention of a technique that could help ensure the survival of photography. This exhibition is a call to rescue, but also an exemplary consideration of photographic images as one of our central means of communication and expression.

The installation, which consists of large-scale photographic and textual elements, builds on the Studio for Propositional Cinema's practice of using the exhibition as a narrative form with large-scale installation works. "The Camera of Disaster" offers a quasi-cinematic experience that unravels viewers as they traverse the exhibition, its texts and images: a dismantled disaster film with a cautiously hopeful ending.

A new catalog of cassettes with texts by Juliana Demers, David Campany and Paulina Pobocha will be released in the summer of 2022 to coincide with the exhibition.

The exhibition was funded by the Hans Fries Foundation, the Stiftung Kunstfonds and the Embassy of Canada. The companies RECOMART and HALBE provided generous support.
